## 2009 HIGHLIGHTS

2010 Campaign raised \$9,433,828.

Chair Scott Lawrence led 900 volunteers who each had a role in this year's successful campaign.

700 companies participated in this year's campaign.

Approximately 30,000 individuals contributed.

Estimate more than 6,000 individuals invested \$500+ through Heart Club.

Alexis de Tocqueville committee, led by Ron Moquist, added 12 new \$10,000+ givers. Total ADT giving increased from \$776,000 to \$916,000.

100 volunteers, led by Chair Sue Aguilar, donated over 1,400 hours in the spring, identifying needs, reviewing results and allocating dollars to partner programs.

Services were provided to 25 communities in Lincoln, McCook, Minnehaha and Turner Counties.

1 in 3 people in the Sioux Empire utilized a United Way partner program.

Partnered with 47 different agencies, providing funds to 98 programs.

Welcomed new partner agency, Pathways, with funds for their FRIENDSLink program.

Launched Genesis. Program engages the community in providing families and individuals with opportunities to achieve safe and permanent housing. Of the 29 participants in the last year, 24 have maintained or improved their housing situation.

Maintained 2nd in the nation in per capita giving among all United Ways.

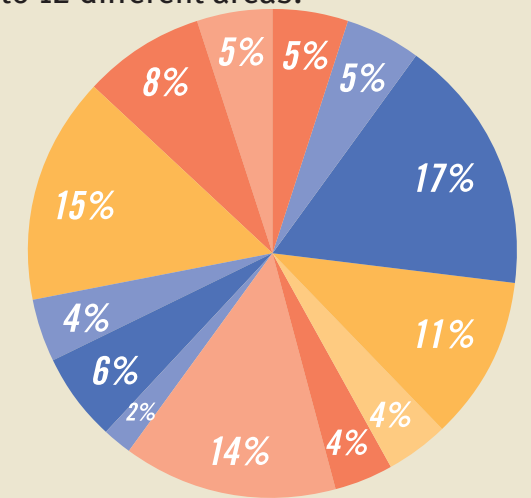
Operated with overhead costs of less than 10%, one of the lowest administrative costs among all United Ways raising more than \$1 million.



## 2009 RESULTS

Investments in Sioux Empire United Way were allocated to 12 different areas:

**After School** - Need: In SD, 74% of children ages 6-12 have both parents working outside the home. Results: 176 children had a safe place to be before and after school through partner program, Dell Rapids Community Haven.

**Basic Needs** - Need: Calls to partner agency HELP!Line Center for food assistance increased by 17% from 2008 to 2009. Results: Partner agency, Lunch is Served, provided 300 sack lunches each week. Surveys of meal recipients showed that 57% would not have eaten during their work day without the free meal.

**Basic Needs** - Need: A one day count on January 19, 2009 identified 447 homeless people in Minnehaha County. Results: Of the adults who left partner program Heartland House in the 2009 program year, 27 were employed full-time or part-time and 23 entered permanent housing.

**Counseling** - Need: Calls to partner agency HELP!Line Center for financial assistance and support increased from 5257 in 2008 to 5510 in 2009. Results: Partner program, Consumer Credit Counseling, provided by Lutheran Social Services, conducted over 3,400 counsels in the past year. This is a 31.5% increase over last year.

**Disabilities** - Need: There are over 15,000 individuals with some sort of disability in the Sioux Empire. Results: Partner SD ACHIEVE's Supported Living provided services to 15% more people than in 2008, changing the lives of more than 150 individuals.

**Emergency Services** - Need: The Sioux Falls Police Department investigated 218 sexual assault cases in 2008 and 231 cases in 2009, an increase of 13 cases. Results: Partner agency, The Compass Center, provided services such as counseling and advocacy to 422 victims of sexual and domestic violence in fiscal year 2009.

**Seniors** - Need: According to a recent SD Department of Social Services study on long-term care services, the number of elders over the age of 65 will double by 2025 and represent 24% of the state's population. Results: Volunteers assisted 384 older adults with household maintenance and yard work through partner program Workers on Wheels.

## YOUR GIFT IN ACTION

### Family Exercises Together

With four young children, Carlos wanted to find a healthy way to spend quality time together as a family. While looking for a gym facility, a friend recommended he check out the YMCA.

“I’ll come and work out five days a week, and bring my children in three times a week,” explains Carlos. “I’m able to drop off my children in the Child Watch area while I work out. They are able to play with kids their own age and they have craft time and art projects. I really like that there are activities for my children, they’re not just running around,” adds Carlos.

Carlos and his family are able to utilize the YMCA’s facilities to stay healthy thanks to scholarship assistance provided by Sioux Empire United Way. “Without the scholarship help, life would be different. My hours have been cut at work, and being able to come here during the week is a huge asset to my family. As a young man with four children, struggling to make ends meet, I am grateful to have this opportunity.”



### Education Never Ends

Solomon’s teenage years were filled with turmoil and uncertainty in his home country. One constant, however, was his strong belief in education. So much so, that after completing his education, he became an elementary school teacher.

About his arrival in Sioux Falls, Solomon explains, “Everything here was different, and the language barrier made it difficult to seek out employment or an education. I knew my old life was over and I would have to work hard, but I wanted to attend college.” A quick referral to Bridges was the perfect fit for his educational goals.

The classes through Bridges helped him with his grammar, writing, reading and other skills. He also credits the program with helping him to adjust to life in America in general. And after graduating from the program, Solomon was easily able to transition into pursuing his Associate Degree in Liberal Arts through Kilian Community College, which he will receive in the spring of 2010.

Solomon hopes to eventually work overseas, helping people, perhaps even in his home country. And after wearing the cap and gown this spring, his immediate plan is to pursue a degree in social work, because “education never ends.”

### Next Best Thing to a Mother’s Care

Upon moving to Sioux Falls and starting a new career, Faith began her search for a childcare center she could trust. She wanted to ensure her children would be safe and enjoy their time in childcare. “I found what I was looking for at YWCA,” explains Faith. “I know my girls are safe here. I like that they have activities throughout the day and are not just sitting in front of a TV.”

Jada who is 7, and Emma who is 3 have been attending the YWCA for a little over a year now. “Jada comes just during the summer and loves it. She gets to go on field trips to places like the Pavilion and library, and they have daily activities,” explains Faith. Emma spends time learning colors, singing songs, doing crafts or getting exercise in YWCA’s gym. “Emma loves playing dress up in the afternoons and I love that they are modeling behaviors for her, like picking up their toys when they’re done playing.”



Studies have shown that low income families pay 14-18% of their income on childcare. Over 46% of all YWCA childcare families receive scholarship or childcare assistance subsidy. “I can go to work each day knowing my girls are taken care of,” ends Faith. “The staff here are genuine and truly care for my children. The care they provide is the next best thing to the own care that I provide as a mother.”
