1 child was provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA)

285 children were given the opportunity to participate in Character Counts!, a youth development opportunity

3 families were able to stay in their homes through assistance from Community Outreach

4 children were provided safe after-school care through Dell Rapids Community Haven

84 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month

1 expectant mother with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the BrightStart Program.

27 people received counseling through Family Service

8 children were able to visit with family members in a safe, supervised atmosphere at the Family Visitation Center

5 families received furniture through the Furniture Mission

5 girls participated in scouting

20 youth received educational, musical, cultural and creative opportunities at the Bowden Youth Center

39 individuals received referral information through the HelpLine Center's 211

12 youth were given the opportunity to play basketball through the YMCA Youth Basketball League.

1 individual was partnered with a volunteer to learn to read through the Literacy Council

29 families utilized credit counseling, therapy and mentoring through Lutheran Social Services

22 children were provided with nutritious, easy-to-prepare foods for the weekend through the BackPack Program.

1 seniors was matched with volunteer opportunities in various non-profit agencies through RSVP

41 families received assistance through the Salvation Army

1 senior was matched with another senior through the Senior Companions Program

3 adults and children who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence receive support services through The Compass Center.

2 individuals with limited or no financial resources received counseling through Sioux Falls Psychological Services

5 children were provided with quality summer childcare through Youth Enrichment Services

1 girl in grades 3rd through 5th was able to participate in Girls on the Run through the YWCA
