10 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 programs.

2 children received quality childcare through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Infant and Toddler Program.

269 children were given the opportunity to participate in Character On Track, a youth development opportunity.

1 expectant mother with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the BrightStart Program.

6 domestic violence victims were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Inn Crisis Intervention.

3 families received one-time financial assistance for basic needs through Community Outreach-Crisis care.

2 adults and child who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence receive support services through The Compass Center.

1 individual participated in educational and therapeutic interventions through The Compass Center's Family Violence Project to end the cycle of domestic violence.

8 children and adults learned the basics of swimming and importance of water safety through EmBe.

11 girls were inspired to be joyful, healthy and confident by participating in Girls on the Run or Heart and Sole, a fun, experience-based curriculum which integrates running.

4 youth were provided with a variety of recreational opportunities through EmBe.

5 people received counseling through Family Service.

5 people were educated on topics related to mental health Family Life Education at Family Service.

10 children were provided with nutritious, easy-to-prepare foods for the weekend through the Backpack Program.

6 families received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

27 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

3 individuals utilized a 24 hour hotline during a crisis or participated in suicide trainings or support groups through Helpline Center's Suicide & Crisis Support.

28 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

7 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

7 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

4 students were provided with a school-based mentor through Lutheran Social Services.

1 family with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault were provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

44 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Health's Success by 6 program.

27 boys participated in Boy Scouts.

1 boys that would not otherwise be involved with Boy Scouts was able to participate in traditional scouting through ScoutReach.

87 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

3 abused or neglected children were provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.

21 students participated in a safe after school program through SF Family YMCA's Middle School After School.

25 students participated in a safe day camp through Camp Leif Erickson.

4 individuals were able to maintain access to psychiatric services through Southeastern Behavioral Healthcare.

2 individuals participated in LifeMarks, an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring (mental health and chemical dependency) concerns of youth, adults and families.

1 child received quality childcare and early childhood education through VOA's Little Blessings.
