1 older adult who are seeking employment were provided assistance in their job search through Active Generations.

1 older adults with dementia were provided with a day program in residential like setting that includes a variety of services at Céilí Cottage.

1 older adult with social, cognitive, or physical limitations were given support through Day Break.

75 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assesments, and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 programs.

9 youth received a supportive adult role model through Big Brothers Big Sisters.

2 youth attended a safe, supervised, and engaged place that focuses on arts, education, and career development, health and life skills, character and leadership skills, and sports and recreation through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Eastside Club.

6 youth received quality childcare and educational programs through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Early Childhood Education.

5 children received quality childcare through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Infant and Toddler Program.

200 students participated in a one-day empathy building program through Challenge Day.

2,697 children were given the opportunity to participate in Character On Track, a youth development opportunity.

3 expectant mothers with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the BrightStart Program.

10 domestic violence victims were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Inn Crisis Intervention.

5 families were provided safe shelter at Children's Inn when fleeing from a domestic abuse situation.

26 families received one-time financial assistance for basic needs through Community Outreach.

7 individuals participated in educational and therapeutic interventions through The Compass Center's Family Violence Project to end the cycle of domestic violence.

7 adults and children who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence received support services through The Compass Center.

559 adults and children learned the basics of swimming and importance of water safety through EmBe.

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7 children received quality childcare and early childhood education through EmBe.

2 women received support, career development tools and professional attire to help them thrive in the work force through Dress for Success.

29 girls were inspired to be joyful, healthy and confident by participating in Girls on the Run or Heart and Sole, a fun, experience-based curriculum which integrates running.

90 youth were provided with a variety of recreational opportunities through EmBe.

1 boy was inspired to be joyful, healthy and confident by participating in Let Me Run, a fun, experience-based curriculum which integrates running.

38 people received counseling through Family Service.

75 people were educated on topics related to mental health Family Life Education at Family Service.

13 individuals who have no means of paying for services were provided free counseling services with Heuermann Counseling Clinic at Family Service.

79 children were provided with nutritious, easy-to-prepare foods for the weekend through the Backpack Program.

11 families received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

114 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

542 individuals utilized a 24 hour hotline during a crisis or participated in suicide trainings or support groups through Helpline Center's Suicide & Crisis Support.

178 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

51 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

34 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

49 students were provided with a school-based mentor through Lutheran Social Services.

20 children participated in therapy through PATH (Providing Access to Healing for Students) with Lutheran Social Services.

6 disabled children and their siblings were provided with after-school and summer care through Lutheran Social Services of SD's Here4Youth program.

3 students were matched with a mentor to receive support, set goals and meet them including finishing high school through Lutheran Social Services.

2 individuals were partnered with a volunteer to learn to read through REACH.

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15 children participated in a five-week program just prior to starting kindergarten to gain skills to start school ready to learn through Ready to Start.

9 families with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault were provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

218 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Health's Success by 6 program.

115 boys participated in Boy Scouts.

4 boys that would not otherwise be involved with Boy Scouts was able to participate in traditional scouting through ScoutReach.

524 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

110 students participated in a safe day camp through Camp Leif Erickson.

8 abused or neglected children were provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.

4 individuals were able to maintain access to psychiatric services through Southeastern Behavioral Healthcare.

6 children received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.

2 youth ages 16-21 received housing, case management, life skills, employment education assistance, and aftercare services through VOA's Independent Living Preparation.

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25 individuals participated in LifeMarks, an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring (mental health and chemical dependency) concerns of youth, adults and families.

5 children received quality childcare and early childhood education through VOA's Little Blessings.

2 children received quality childcare and early childhood education through VOA's Childcare & Family Literacy Center.

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
