

SIoux EMPIRE UNITED WAY SERVICES IN YOUR TOWN HARTFORD

155 older adults were provided nutritional meals in their homes or in a congregate dining setting, allowing them to maintain a healthy and independent lifestyle through Active Generations.

2 older adult who are seeking employment were provided assistance in their job search through Active Generations.

28 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 programs.

1 youth received quality childcare and educational programs through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Early Childhood Education.

2 children received quality childcare through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Infant and Toddler Program.

3 youth attended a safe, supervised, and engaged place that focuses on arts, education, and career development, health and life skills, character and leadership skills, and sports and recreation through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Eastside Club.

3 youth received a supportive adult role model through Big Brothers Big Sisters.

174 students participated in a one-day empathy building program through Challenge Day.

724 children were given the opportunity to participate in Character On Track, a youth development opportunity.

2 expectant mothers with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the BrightStart Program.

8 domestic violence victims were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Inn Crisis Intervention.

17 families received one-time financial assistance for basic needs through Community Outreach.

4 families who were homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless were paired with volunteer mentors through the Genesis program of Community Outreach.

3 individual participated in educational and therapeutic interventions through The Compass Center's Family Violence Project to end the cycle of domestic violence.

9 adult and child who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence receive support services through The Compass Center.

351 children and adults learned the basics of swimming and importance of water safety through EmBe.

2 children received quality childcare and early childhood education through EmBe.

16 girls were inspired to be joyful, healthy and confident by participating in Girls on the Run or Heart and Sole, a fun, experience-based curriculum which integrates running.

29 youth were provided with a variety of recreational opportunities through EmBe.

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6 people received counseling through Family Service.

18 children were provided with nutritious, easy-to-prepare foods for the weekend through the BackPack Program.

140 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

1 individuals utilized a 24 hour hotline during a crisis or participated in suicide trainings or support groups through Helpline Center's Suicide & Crisis Support.

47 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

20 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

13 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

16 students were provided with a school-based mentor through Lutheran Social Services.

1 disabled child and their siblings were provided with after-school and summer care through Lutheran Social Services of SD's Here4Youth program.

2 students were matched with a mentor to receive support, set goals and meet them including finishing high school through Lutheran Social Services.

1 individual were partnered with a volunteer to learn to read through REACH.

111 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Health's Success by 6 program.

9 juvenile offenders participated in Teen Court or a Juvenile Diversion program through Boy Scouts.

80 boys participated in Boy Scouts.

2 boy that would not otherwise be involved with Boy Scouts was able to participate in traditional scouting through ScoutReach.

249 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

16 students participated in a safe day camp through Camp Leif Erickson.

4 abused or neglected children were provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.

8 individuals and families attained the skills to improve their earning power and end welfare dependency through Family Self Sufficiency.

7 individuals were able to maintain access to psychiatric services through Southeastern Behavioral Healthcare.

2 children received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.

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6 individuals participated in LifeMarks, an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring (mental health and chemical dependency) concerns of youth, adults and families.

1 children received quality childcare and early childhood education through VOA's Childcare & Family Literacy Center.

2 moms and families impacted by maternal incarceration received comprehensive wraparound services.
