87 older adults were provided nutritional meals in their homes or in a congregate dining setting, allowing them to maintain a healthy and independent lifestyle through Active Generations.

1 older adult who are seeking employment were provided assistance in their job search through Active Generations.

2 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources from Avera McKennan's Success by 6 programs.

1 youth received a supportive adult role model through Big Brothers Big Sisters.

2 children received quality childcare through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Infant and Toddler Program.

137 children were given the opportunity to participate in Character On Track, a youth development opportunity.

1 expectant mother with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the Bright Start Program.

1 individual participated in educational and therapeutic interventions through The Compass Center's Family Violence Project to end the cycle of domestic violence.

2 adults and children who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence received support services through The Compass Center.

8 children and adults learned the basics of swimming and water safety through EmBe.

1 youth were provided with a variety of recreational opportunities through EmBe.

1 individual received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

2 individuals utilized a 24 hour hotline during a crisis or participated in suicide trainings or support groups through Helpline Center's Suicide & Crisis Support.

3 individuals received information about volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

5 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

5 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

1 student were matched with a mentor to receive support, set goals and meet them including finishing high school through Lutheran Social Services.

2 families with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault were provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

20 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Health's Success by 6 program.

23 boys participated in Boy Scouts.

42 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

4 individuals were able to maintain access to psychiatric services through Southeastern Behavioral Healthcare.
