

# SIoux EMPIRE UNITED WAY SERVICES IN YOUR TOWN

## SIoux FALLS

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**233 older adults** who are seeking employment were provided assistance in their job search through Active Generations.

**143 older adults** with social, cognitive, or physical limitations were given support through Day Break.

**1,812 older adults** were provided nutritional meals in their homes or in a congregate dining setting, allowing them to maintain a healthy and independent lifestyle through Active Generations.

**18 older adults with dementia** were provided with a day program in residential like setting that includes a variety of services at Céilí Cottage.

**525 older adults** were able to continue living independently with the help of volunteers who complete light household chores and provide transportation through Workers on Wheels.

**79 adults with disabilities** were provided with specialized education and recreational opportunities for adults with disabilities along with reverse integration opportunities for Augustana University students by participating in FRIENDSLink.

**299 families** were matched with a family health coordinator, who helps build family connection and stability, through early intervention services that are based on the individual family needs.

**1,302 new parents** received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 programs.

**115 children** were provided with temporary care through Bethany Christian Service's Safe Families' network of volunteer host families, while their parents were faced with unmanageable or critical circumstances.

**649 juvenile offenders** participated in Teen Court or a Juvenile Diversion program through Boy Scouts.

**2,680 boys** participated in Boy Scouts.

**845 boys** that would not otherwise be involved with Boy Scouts was able to participate in traditional scouting through ScoutReach.

**409 youth** received quality childcare and educational programs through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Early Childhood Education.

**352 youth** attended a safe, supervised, and engaged place that focuses on arts, education, and career development, health and life skills, character and leadership skills, and sports and recreation through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Eastside Club.

**21,118 children** were given the opportunity to participate in Character On Track, a youth development opportunity.

**168 expectant mothers** with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the BrightStart Program.

**1,650 domestic violence victims** were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Inn Crisis Intervention.

## SHIUX FALLS

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**776 families** were provided safe shelter at Children's Inn when fleeing from a domestic abuse situation.

**130 individuals with disabilities** were provided with recreational and social activities through DakotAbilities.

**288 children** were provided with dental screenings and services through Delta Dental's Mobile Dental Program.

**5,316 children and adults** learned the basics of swimming and importance of water safety through EmBe.

**319 children** received quality childcare and early childhood education through EmBe.

**293 women** were provided with professional attire, a network of support to grow professionally and personally, and access to career development tools through Dress for Success.

**553 girls** were inspired to be joyful, healthy and confident by participating in Girls on the Run or Heart and Sole, a fun, experience-based curriculum which integrates running.

**82 boys** were inspired through the power of running to be courageous enough to be themselves, build healthy relationships, and live an active lifestyle by participating in Let Me Run.

**1,416 youth** were provided with a variety of recreational opportunities through EmBe.

**293 children** with an incarcerated parent were provided support groups, family events and summer camp scholarships through Family Connection.

**944 people** received counseling through Family Service.

**133 individuals who have no means of paying for services** were provided free counseling services Heuermann Counseling Clinic at Family Service.

**2,510 children** were provided with nutritious, easy-to-prepare foods for the weekend through the Backpack Program.

**4,381 families** received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

**72 individuals with disabilities** received therapeutic horseback riding, hippotherapy, or other services through HorsePower.

**60 students** participated in a free after-school music program through Harmony South Dakota.

**24,336 individuals** received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

**59 isolated or homebound older adults** were provided with personal phone calls to reduce loneliness and provide information about additional community services through Helpline Center's Outreach Support.

**3,877 individuals** utilized a 24 hour hotline during a crisis or participated in suicide trainings or support groups through Helpline Center's Suicide & Crisis Support.

**10,054 individuals** received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

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**93 young children** and their families participated in Early Head Start services through Inter-Lakes Community Action Partnership.

**399 families** with children were provided transitional housing through Heartland House.

**84 low-income children** participated in a free after-school program through KIDSTOP.

**134 students** participated in hands-on, enriching activities during out of school time hours through Lutheran Social Services.

**64 older adults** were matched with an adult volunteer for social and recreational opportunities through Lutheran Social Services' Better Together program.

**2,637 individuals** utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

**127 youth** received a supportive adult role model through Climb.

**818 individuals and families** participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

**1,212 students** were provided with a school-based mentor through Lutheran Social Services.

**138 adults** who had committed domestic violence were provided with therapy groups that taught safe and healthy relationship skills through Lutheran Social Services' Family Violence Project.

**54 disabled children and their siblings** were provided with after-school and summer care through Lutheran Social Services of SD's Here4Youth program.

**202 K-12 students** were provided professional mental health counseling sessions directly in their school through PATH.

**66 parents** who have been recently released from jail or prison were provided with support to re-integrate into their families and communities through Lutheran Social Services' Fatherhood & Re-Entry Services.

**156 high school students** provided with a long-term volunteer mentor through USucceed.

**688 youth** received after school and summer care through the Multi-Cultural Center.

**148 individuals** were partnered with a volunteer to learn to read through REACH.

**90 children** participated in a five-week program just prior to starting kindergarten to gain skills to start school ready to learn through Ready to Start.

**20 children** and their parents or caregivers participated in Sad Isn't Bad's grief support program.

**402 families** with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault were provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

**2,778 new parents** received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Health's Success by 6 program.

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**147 children** were provided free dental care during the one-day Sioux Empire Smiles event.

**518 abused or neglected children** were provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.

**1,137 students** participated in a safe after school program through SF Family YMCA's Middle School After School.

**34 children** were provided with a scholarship to attend a quality preschool program through Sioux Falls Hope Coalition.

**440 individuals and families** attained the skills to improve their earning power and end welfare dependency through Family Self Sufficiency.

**68 three and four year olds** were provided access to quality pre-kindergarten programs through the Preschool Opportunity Program of the Sioux Falls School District.

**2,398 students and their families** were provided with support as they adjust to a new culture and language through Sioux Falls School District's School Home Refugee and Immigrant program.

**406 single guests & families with children** were provided the needed step between homelessness and long-term housing through St. Francis House.

**1,742 families** received one-time financial assistance for basic needs through Community Outreach.

**83 families** who were homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless were paired with volunteer mentors through the Genesis program of Community Outreach.

**329 adults and children** who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence receive support services through The Compass Center.

**1,704 individuals** received education or training about sexual assault through The Compass Center.

**181 sexual assault victims** were provided with advocacy services that included navigating court system, filing protection orders, and safety planning through The Compass Center's Victim Advocacy program.

**133 children** attended affordable childcare through United Childcare and Preschool.

**830 middle and high school students** attended Challenge Day, a one-day program that focuses on empathy skill building.

**543 children** were able to participate in a youth development activity that they would otherwise not be able to due to a lack of financial resources.

**6,640 children** received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

**69 children** received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.

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**31 youth** ages 16-21 with housing, case management, life skills, employment education assistance, and aftercare services through VOA's Independent Living Preparation.

**445 individuals** participated in LifeMarks, an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring (mental health and chemical dependency) concerns of youth, adults and families.

**36 students** in grades K-5 were provided with a free after school program through VOA's Kidz Count.

**199 moms and families** impacted by maternal incarceration received comprehensive wraparound services.

**213 individuals** received various outreach services through Volunteers of America, Dakotas.

**174 children** received quality childcare and early childhood education through VOA's Childcare program.

**390 veterans** were provided with daytime shelter and meals and case management assistance through Volunteers of America Dakota's Veterans Service Center.

**184 youth** received educational, musical, cultural and creative opportunities at the Youth Center of VOA.

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
