158 older adults who are seeking employment were provided assistance in their job search through Active Generations.

18 older adults with dementia were provided with a day program in residential like setting that includes a variety of services at Céilí Cottage.

143 older adults with social, cognitive, or physical limitations were given support through Day Break.

1812 older adults were provided nutritional meals in their homes or in a congregate dining setting, allowing them to maintain a healthy and independent lifestyle through Active Generations.

525 older adults were able to continue living independently with the help of volunteers who complete light household chores and provide transportation through Workers on Wheels.

53 individuals with disabilities paired with Augustana students through FRIENDSLink to enjoy each other's company and learn they have more in common than their differences.

376 families were matched with a family health coordinator, who helps build family connection and stability, through early intervention services that are based on the individual family needs.

1260 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 programs.

62 families received support in a time of a crisis through Safe Families for Children to prevent neglect and abuse with Bethany Christian Services.

362 youth received a supportive adult role model through Big Brothers Big Sisters.

647 youth attended a safe, supervised, and engaged place that focuses on arts, education, and career development, health and life skills, character and leadership skills, and sports and recreation through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Eastside Club.

243 youth received quality childcare and educational programs through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Early Childhood Education.

288 children received quality childcare through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Youth Enrichment Services Infant and Toddler Program.

15897 children were given the opportunity to participate in Character On Track, a youth development opportunity.

213 expectant mothers with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the BrightStart Program.

1306 domestic violence victims were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Inn Crisis Intervention.

784 families were provided safe shelter at Children's Inn when fleeing from a domestic abuse situation.

3601 families received one-time financial assistance for basic needs through Community Outreach.

134 families who were homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless were paired with volunteer mentors through the Genesis program of Community Outreach.

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1551 individuals received training and education to help prevent domestic violence in the workplace.

248 individuals participated in educational and therapeutic interventions through The Compass Center's Family Violence Project to end the cycle of domestic violence.

423 adults and children who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence receive support services through The Compass Center.

59 individuals with disabilities were provided with recreational and social activities through DakotAbilities.

244 children were provided with dental screenings and services through Delta Dental's Mobile Dental Program.

5930 children and adults learned the basics of swimming and importance of water safety through EmBe.

304 children received quality childcare and early childhood education through EmBe.

716 girls were inspired to be joyful, healthy and confident by participating in Girls on the Run or Heart and Sole, a fun, experience-based curriculum which integrates running.

113 boys were inspired to be joyful, healthy and confident by participating in Let Me Run, a fun, experience-based curriculum which integrates running.

1462 youth were provided with a variety of recreational opportunities through EmBe.

397 women received support, career development tools and professional attire to help them thrive in the work force through Dress for Success.

303 children with an incarcerated parent were provided support groups, family events and summer camp scholarships through Family Connection.

850 people received counseling through Family Service.

3154 people were educated on topics related to mental health Family Life Education at Family Service.

94 individuals who have no means of paying for services were provided free counseling services Heuermann Counseling Clinic at Family Service.

2777 children were provided with nutritious, easy-to-prepare foods for the weekend through the Backpack Program.

4387 families received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

22,906 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

5476 individuals utilized a 24 hour hotline during a crisis or participated in suicide trainings or support groups through Helpline Center's Suicide & Crisis Support.

9727 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

89 individuals with disabilities received therapeutic horseback riding, hippotherapy, or other services through HorsePower

287 families with children were provided transitional housing through Heartland House.

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132 young children and their families participated in Early Head Start services through Inter-Lakes Community Action Partnership.

73 low-income children participated in a free after-school program through KIDSTOP.

114 students participated in hands-on, enriching activities during out of school time hours through Lutheran Social Services.

47 older adults were matched with an adult volunteer for social and recreational opportunities through Lutheran Social Services' Better Together program.

28000 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

849 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

1174 students were provided with a school-based mentor through Lutheran Social Services.

21 children and their parents or caregivers participated in Sad Isn't Bad's grief support program.

393 families with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault were provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

2656 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Health's Success by 6 program.

681 juvenile offenders participated in Teen Court or a Juvenile Diversion program through Boy Scouts.

2453 boys participated in Boy Scouts.

709 boys that would not otherwise be involved with Boy Scouts was able to participate in traditional scouting through ScoutReach.

558 children were able to participate in a youth development activity that they would otherwise not be able to due to a lack of financial resources.

7115 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

268 abused or neglected children were provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.

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1104 students participated in a safe after school program through SF Family YMCA's Middle School After School.

7,115 students participated in a safe day camp through Camp Leif Erickson.

484 individuals and families attained the skills to improve their earning power and end welfare dependency through Family Self Sufficiency.

68 three and four year olds were provided access to quality pre-kindergarten programs through the Preschool Opportunity Program of the Sioux Falls School District.

2287 students and their families were provided with support as they adjust to a new culture and language through Sioux Falls School District's School Home Refugee and Immigrant program.

1292 individuals were able to maintain access to psychiatric services through Southeastern Behavioral Healthcare.

428 single guests & families with children were provided the needed step between homelessness and long-term housing through St. Francis House.

131 children attended affordable childcare through United Childcare and Preschool.

152 children received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.

360 youth received educational, musical, cultural and creative opportunities at the Bowden Youth Center.

249 children received quality childcare and early childhood education through VOA's Childcare & Family Literacy Center.

35 youth ages 16-21 with housing, case management, life skills, employment education assistance, and aftercare services through VOA's Independent Living Preparation.

39 students in grades K-5 were provided with a free after school program through VOA's Kidz Count.

332 individuals participated in LifeMarks, an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring (mental health and chemical dependency) concerns of youth, adults and families.
