1 older adult with social, cognitive, or physical limitations was given support through Active Generations' Day Break.

15 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 program.

3 domestic violence victims were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Home Shelter for Family Safety's Crisis Intervention.

2 vulnerable adults and financially limited people were assisted with family law issues such as protection orders, custody/visitation or divorce through East River Legal Services.

1 child received quality childcare and educational programs through EmBe.

280 youth were provided knowledge and tools from Emily's Hope to make informed, health choices and avoid substance abuse.

1 individual was provided access to naloxone and fentanyl test strips free of charge from Emily's Hope.

5 youth were provided backpacks with nutritious meal ingredients to help decrease childhood hunger from Feeding South Dakota.

5 families received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

72 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

10 people were connected to the appropriate resources via a shared network to coordinate basic needs services Helpline Center's Network of Care.

6 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

2 individuals and families were provided with financial support and resources after losing a loved one to suicide through Lost&Found's Survivors Joining for Hope program.



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7 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

13 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

2 at-risk youth are paired withh a supportive adult role model through Lutheran Social Service' Community Mentoring program.

2 adults who had committed domestic violence were provided with therapy groups that taught safe and healthy relationship skills through Lutheran Social Services' Family Violence Project.

8 youth were provided with an adult mentor to establish a trusting relationship through LSS's In School Mentoring program.

12 students were provided professional mental health counseling sessions directly in their school through PATH.

18 new parents received information about their child's development and tempermanent through Sanford Childrens' Success by 6 program.

54 youth participated in Scouting America which helps to build self-confidence, develops leadership and decision making in youth.

101 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

1 abused or neglected child was provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.

1 family received one-time financial assistance for basic needs through Community Outreach.

49 children were able to enhance their learning delvelopment through play with their unique toy boxes from Toy Lending Library.

2 children received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.

2 individuals participated in an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring
