- **15 new parents** received resource booklets, temperament assesments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 program.
- 3 domestic violence victims were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Home Shelter for Family Safety's Crisis Intervention.
- 2 vulnerable adults and financially limited people were assisted with family law issues such as protection orders, custody/visitation or divorce through East River Legal Services.
- **1 child** received quality childcare and educational programs through EmBe.
- **280 youth** were provided knowledge and tools from Emily's Hope to make informed, health choices and avoid substance abuse.

- 1 individual was provided access to naloxone and fentanyl test strips free of charge from Emily's Hope.
