1 care giver of adult loved ones were provided with assistance, education, and support through Active Generations' CAREgivers program.

11 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 program.

4 domestic violence victims were provided with immediate information and support through Children's Home Shelter for Family Safety's Crisis Intervention.

4 vulnerable adults and financially limited people were assisted with family law issues such as protection orders, custody/visitation or divorce through East River Legal Services.

1 child received quality childcare and educational programs through EmBe.

5 families received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

2 individuals with disabilities received therapeutic horseback riding, hippotherapy, or other services through HorsePower.

142 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

13 people were connected to the appropriate resources via a shared network to coordinate basic needs services Helpline Center's Network of Care.

6 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

3 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

2 older adults were matched with an adult volunteer for social and recreational opportunities through Lutheran Social Services' Better Together program.

2 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

1 at-risk youth was paired with a supportive adult role model through Lutheran Social Services' Community Mentoring program.

4 adults who had committed domestic violence were provided with therapy groups that taught safe and healthy relationship skills through Lutheran Social Services' Family Violence Project.

1 child was provided with a long-term volunteer mentor through LSS's High School Mentoring program.

16 youth were provided with an adult mentor to establish a trusting relationship through LSS's In School Mentoring program.

6 students were provided professional mental health counseling sessions directly in their school through PATH.

3 families with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault were provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

41 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Children's Success by 6 program.

106 children participated in Scouting America which helps to build self-confidence, develops leadership and decision making in youth.

1 juvenile offender participated in Teen Court or a Juvenile Diversion program through Scouting America which helps keep youth out of the court system, decrease truancy and improve mental and behavioral health.

6 children were able to participate in a youth development activity that they would otherwise not be able to due to a lack of financial resources through Connecting Kids.

143 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

5 abused or neglected children were provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.
