**160 older adults** were provided nutritional meals in their homes or in a congregate dining setting, allowing them to maintain a healthy and independent lifestyle through Active Generations.

**15 new parents** received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 programs.

**1 juvenile offender** participated in Teen Court or a Juvenile Diversion program through Boy Scouts.

**127 boys** participated in Boy Scouts.

**660 children** were given the opportunity to participate in Character On Track, a youth development opportunity.

**1 expectant mother** with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through the BrightStart Program.

**1 domestic violence victim** was provided with immediate information and support through Children's Inn Crisis Intervention.

**3 adults and children** who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence receive support services through The Compass Center.

**2 sexual assault victims** were provided with advocacy services that included navigating court system, filing protection orders, and safety planning through The Compass Center's Victim Advocacy program.

**22 people** received counseling through Family Service.

**1 individual who had no means of paying for services** was provided free counseling services Heuermann Counseling Clinic at Family Service.

**10 families** received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

**1 individual with disabilities** received therapeutic horseback riding, hippotherapy, or other services through HorsePower

**159 individuals** received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

**41 people** were connected to the appropriate resources via a shared network to coordinate basic needs services Helpline Center's Network of Care.

**11 isolated or homebound older adults** were provided with personal phone calls to reduce loneliness and provide information about additional community services through Helpline Center's Outreach Support.

**43 individuals** utilized a 24 hour hotline during a crisis or participated in suicide trainings or support groups through Helpline Center's Suicide & Crisis Support.

**12 individuals** received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

**11 individuals and families** participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

**22 individuals** utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.

**1 youth** received a supportive adult role model through Lutheran Social Service' Community Mentoring program.

**4 students** were provided with an in-school mentor through Lutheran Social Services.

**1 adult** who had committed domestic violence was provided with therapy groups that taught safe and healthy relationship skills through Lutheran Social Services' Family Violence Project.

**5 K-12 students** were provided professional mental health counseling sessions directly in their school through PATH.

**18 children** participated in a five-week program just prior to starting kindergarten to gain skills to start school ready to learn through Ready to Start.

**4 families** with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault were provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

**17 new parents** received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Health's Success by 6 program.

**1 abused or neglected children** was provided a volunteer advocate, who served on the child's behalf through the overburdened juvenile court system through SF Area CASA.

**2 children** received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.

**4 individuals** participated in an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring (mental health and chemical dependency) concerns of youth, adults and families through Volunteers of America, Dakotas.

**1 child** was able to participate in a youth development activity that they would otherwise not be able to due to a lack of financial resources through Connecting Kids.

**109 children** received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.
