85 children ages 3 to 10 were provided education on topics such as burn prevention, smoke alarms, home escape plan, cooking safety, eating healthy, and physical wellness through the Avera McKennan's Fire and Burn Prevention program.

3 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 program.

1 vulnerable adult and financially limited person was assisted with family law issues such as protection orders, custody/visitation or divorce through East River Legal Services.

2 children received quality childcare and educational programs through EmBe.

45 youth were provided backpacks with nutritious meal ingredients to help decrease childhood hunger from Feeding South Dakota.

1 individual with disabilities received therapeutic horseback riding, hippotherapy, or other services through HorsePower.

28 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

3 people were connected to the appropriate resources via a shared network to coordinate basic needs services Helpline Center's Network of Care.

6 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

2 individuals and families were provided with financial support and resources after losing a loved one to suicide through Lost&Found's Survivors Joining for Hope program.

2 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

2 older adults were matched with an adult volunteer for social and recreational opportunities through Lutheran Social Services' Better Together program.

7 individuals utilized credit counseling through Lutheran Social Services.



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3 youth were provided with an adult mentor to establish a trusting relationship through LSS's In School Mentoring program.

1 family with children who were victims of abuse or sexual assault was provided with counseling and support through Sanford Health's Child's Voice Family Advocate.

1 new parent received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Children's Success by 6 program.

17 youth participated in Scouting America which helps to build self-confidence, develops leadership and decision making in youth.

32 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

1 child received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.

1 individual participated in an outpatient counseling program, addressing the co-occurring (mental health and chemical dependency) concerns of youth, adults and families through Volunteers of America, Dakotas.
