6 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 program.

2 youth received quality childcare and educational programs through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's Early Childhood Education.

1 expectant mother with limited resources received home visits from nurses during pregnancy and after delivery through Children's Home Shelter for Family Safety's BrightStart Program.

1 vulnerable adult and financially limited person was assisted with family law issues such as protection orders, custody/visitation or divorce through East River Legal Services.

93 youth were provided knowledge and tools from Emily's Hope to make informed, health choices and avoid substance abuse.

3 individuals were provided access to naloxone and fentanyl test strips free of charge from Emily's Hope.

20 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

3 people were connected to the appropriate resources via a shared network to coordinate basic needs services Helpline Center's Network of Care.

2 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

1 adult who had committed domestic violence was provided with therapy groups that taught safe and healthy relationship skills through Lutheran Social Services' Family Violence Project.

7 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Children's Success by 6 program.

19 youth participated in Scouting America which helps to build self-confidence, develops leadership and decision making in youth.

52 children received books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program that provides the



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opportunity for children 5 years of age and under to receive a book each month.

2 children were provided with a scholarship to attend a quality preschool program through Sioux Falls Hope Coalition.

1 family received one-time financial assistance for basic needs through Community Outreach.

1 adult and child who were victims of sexual assault or domestic violence received support services through The Compass Center.

1 child received evaluation and treatment for communication disorders through USD Scottish Rite Children's Clinic.
